From the eighteenth century workshops of Williamsburg to the twentieth century garages of Silicon Valley, America created spaces to make things. This lecture explores the forces that made early America a fertile ground for innovation and for the American identity as creators and makers. Coming together from diverse backgrounds, American makers crafted both objects and a democracy that strove to be more perfect. The stories told by their objects remain relevant. Today the trade shops at historic sites, television shows, social media, and even YouTube

videos carry the lessons of America's early innovators into the antique shows and makerspaces of the 21st century.
